President Kathryn Padgett called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. The minutes of the June 13, 2012 double board meeting were approved.

Old Business:

President Kathryn Padgett announced the resignation of Shirley Waxman as Adult Teams Chair and acceptance of Laura DePaoli as her replacement. A motion was passed unanimously to accept Laura Depaoli.

BOARD REPORTS

President: Kathryn Padgett

Kathryn asked for an approval to accept the resignation of Roy Nixon. A motion was passed.

She also asked for approval for a Leave of Absence for Shirley Waxman, Deanna Major, and Carolyn Pappas. A motion was passed.

Donations in the form of some recognition for Laura Creasy and Pamela Skenderian were discussed. A motion was passed to create a webpage in Laura Creasy's name. A motion was passed to create a scholarship in Pamela Skenderians name to the Cuesta program.

Kathryn thanked the docents who participated in the countless meetings this summer to establish the calendars, teams, website, and other activities for the Docent Council. She also recognized Lori Mohr for her thoughtful, organized, and interesting La Muse newsletters throughout the summer. She will continue as editor for another year. Kathryn announced that she will devote a portion of her monthly La Muse President's message to spotlighting what we do well. It is important for our membership to realize the depth and breadth of things that we do as docents. She will be featuring the new Alzheimer's project that we are doing in conjunction with the Santa Barbara Alzheimer's Association. Karen Brill has done some remarkable work with this project.

She also announced that docents will pilot "10 talks" on the free Thursdays. These should be considered a "work in progress". Molora and Laura will report on this program in their report.

Kathryn reported that there will be 14 new provisional beginning the docent program on September 27.

Jerry and Nancy Jensen have expressed interest in hosting the Holiday Party. Paul Guido has also expressed interest.

Docents are responding to a call for a Social Committee as announced in the September La Muse. Volunteers (Joan Dewhirst, Christine Holland, Gabriela Schooley, Francis Hallinan, Ann Hammond, Kathy Eastman, and Gail Stichler) have responded to take the lead for specific events.

Christine Holland has offered her home for the first meeting, proposed for the week of September 24th. The first discussion was discussion for the first fall field trip. Among special interest are a visit to the conservation lab, the SBMA basement to see how paintings are stored, as well as in visiting art schools, film, animation, and graphic design studios to see and discuss art influences. The trip will be planned in the first in the week of November 4th.





STUDENT TEAMS: Ann Robinson

Ann reported that the new student team year was underway. Student museum touring teams are in place and this year there are 40 docents, which results in 6 docent teams with 6 members each. The team leaders are: Ralph Wilson, Rosemarie Gebhart, Loree Gold, Andrea Gallo, Barbara Ruediger and Molora Vadnais. The Classroom Presentation Team leader is Sylvia Mabee with 6 docents: 3 returning docents and new docent members. The Jr/Sr High School Team has a solid 10 docents. Many of them are experienced.

A recent meeting with Rachel Krieps, Amanda Garcia, Sylvia Mabee, team leader for the Classroom Presentation Team, and I focused on providing direction and expertise for the PowerPoint presentation and was highly productive. A workshop is scheduled for the entire team to meet with Rachel and Amanda on Tuesday, September 18, 2012 at 11:00am in the provisional classroom. This workshop will include computer training, the selection of art images, and develop cohesive power point presentations. The Education Department Teacher's Open House is scheduled for Friday, October 5th at 4:00 to 6:00pm.

I will be meeting with Patsy Hicks as her expectations of a Research Chairperson with the Education Department.

Docents will be notified shortly that they will be evaluated this docent year of 2012-2013. The Getty Museum will be hosting a panel discussion on the Siqueiros murals led by Diane DuPont.

There is a museum restructuring re: Free Thursday admissions to the Museum. Sundays will now require an admission fee. The Family Resource Center is now open. Events are still in formation. Patsy informed the board that the Curators may want to give a talk occasionally on a Thursday evening. There is no target date. IPADS are being used in the Antiquities gallery/Thayer to show images that are not being displayed in the gallery.
