9	Content	I. The physical appearance of a work of art- its materials, style and composition.
10	Subject Matter	j. An art form in which an entire room or similar space is treated as a work of art.
11	Iconography	k. The identification, description, and Interpretation of subject matter in art.
12	Context	I. Descriptive of an approach to portraying the visible world that emphasizes the objective observation and accurate imitation of appearances
13	Installation	m. A characteristic(s) that we can identify as constant, recurring or coherent associated with a particular artist, group or culture.
