Three Minute Talk Guidelines

Introduce yourself (This will not be included in timed 3 minutes)

Delivery:

- 1. Stand next to work and do not obstruct it
- 2. Face the audience
- 3. Maintain eye contact
- 4. Do not use notes
- 5. Maintain a distance of 12" from object
- 6. Make sure your voice is clearly audible
- 7. Use correct pronunciation
- 8. Dress professionally
- 9. Smile and engage your audience!

Content:

- 1. Always say:
 - a. Title
 - b. Artist
 - c. Date (use BCE/CE)
 - d. Origin (country)
 - e. Medium
- 2. Be accurate, check and re-check your facts
- 3. Focus on what can be seen in the artwork, using "elements of art"
- 4. Make sure your visual analysis is clear
- 5. Use good art vocabulary and explain/define any art terms that might be new to your audience, e.g., "contropposto, impasto, mudra"
- 6. Include variety of information: balance aesthetic, historical, anecdotal and technical

Transition to another object:

- 1. Provide hook to keep interest of audience by creating anticipation, be enticing (Not: "Now we're going to another gallery...")
- 2. Keep it simple 1 -2 sentences only
- 3. Deliver before walking
